Europa Nostra's next year's EUROPEAN HERITAGE CONGRESS will take place in Athens, on 13 – 17 June 2013. It will bring together members of Europa Nostra and other representatives of the ever-growing cultural heritage movement from all over Europe. This Congress will mark the 50th anniversary of Europa Nostra's continuous action in favour of Europe's cultural heritage. The Congress will be organised with the invaluable assistance of our member organisation and our country representation in Greece, Elliniki Etairia which itself, has this year celebrated 40 years of action on the protection of the environment and the cultural heritage of Greece and Cyprus. She also took the initiative to host a meeting with members of the Europa Nostra Board and a series of associations, foundations and individuals committed to cultural heritage in Cyprus. HERITAGE IN DANGER

CAMPAIGN TO SAVE GAS LIGHT AND GAS LANTERNS IN BERLIN

Europa Nostra wrote earlier this year to the Ruling Mayor of Berlin, Klaus Wowereit, stressing the significance of the gas light heritage in Berlin, and appealing for a moratorium before further removal and conversion to electric light takes place. This appeal has set in motion greater engagement of citizens, further mobilised the public and resulted in many articles in press and media. Inspired by the initiative of Europa Nostra the Berlin Curatorium of its member organisation, Deutsche Stiftung Denkmalschutz, organised an important public discussion with experts on the issue in the Town Hall of Charlottenburg, one of the main areas with many historic gas lanterns located in western Berlin. In response, The Senate of Berlin hastily organised a press conference which resulted in critical and unfavourable media reports of the policy led by the Senate and featuring Europa Nostra's support to the campaign to save Berlin's gas light and gas lanterns in major newspapers of the German-speaking world (e.g. Frankfurter Allgemeine Zeitung, Süddeutsche Zeitung, Neue Zürcher Zeitung). ROSIA MONTANA: EUROPA NOSTRA WRITES TO THE NEW GOVERNMENT OF ROMANIA

At the Europa Nostra's Annual Congress, including a public Forum on “Saving Europe's Endangered Heritage”, which was held in Lisbon, Europa Nostra members expressed, once again, their deep concern regarding the Rosia Montana open ore mining project and the major threats it represents for the unique cultural heritage, as well as for the natural landscape and the environment of the entire area of Rosia Montana. Following this Congress, Europa Nostra sent a letter to the new Prime Minister of Romania, Mr Victor Ponta, conveying to him our members' concerns. Europa Nostra received a

HOUSE OF EUROPEAN HISTORY IN THE EASTMAN BUILDING IN BRUSSELS

The House of European History is an initiative of the European Parliament launched by Hans-Gert Pöttering in February 2007, in his inaugural speech as President of the European Parliament. The House of European History aims to promote a better understanding of European history and integration through a new cultural institution and exhibition centre. End of May 2012, Europa Nostra has been alerted by Europa Nostra Belgium, its Belgian country representation, about the alleged threats to the former Eastman Institute due to the plan to alter its volume fundamentally in order to adapt it to the needs of the future House of European History. EUROPEAN UNION PRIZE FOR CULTURAL HERITAGE / EUROPA NOSTRA AWARDS

2013 AWARD ENTRIES RECEIVED

This year, a total of 197 candidatures from 29 different countries were received at the Europa Nostra International Secretariat in The Hague. The selection process of the European Union Prize for Cultural Heritage / Europa Nostra Awards 2013 has started: the Awards Juries will meet next January and February to choose the winning entries. The largest number of entries was received in Category 1 (Conservation). For Categories 2 (Research) and 3 (Dedicated Service to Heritage) we received the same number of applications as last year while the Category 4 (Education, Training, and Awareness-Raising) saw an increase of 39%. The EU Prize for Cultural Heritage / Europa Nostra local award ceremony, for the exemplary restoration and enhancement of the Ancient Citadel at Aghios Andreas, took place on the island of Sifnos on Saturday 13 October 2012. It was a very significant moment for the island, as well as for the entire country, as it underlined the pan-European recognition of the efforts, currently being executed around Greece, on issues of culture, often under difficult conditions and during a very negative economic period for the country. LOCAL AWARD CEREMONY AT LIUBAVAS MANOR WATERMILL MUSEUM, LITHUANIA

On 18 September, the President of Lithuania, Dalia Grybauskaitė, addressed a large audience of some 200 local adults and children in a beautiful rural area some 10k north of the capital, Vilnius. They were assembled to celebrate the EU Prize for Cultural Heritage/Europa Nostra Award to Liubavas Manor Watermill. On her arrival, the President unveiled the Europa Nostra plaque, which is now installed as part of the exhibition. And then, at the rear of the mill, she spoke to the visitors, followed by the Minister of Culture, and Alfredas Jomantas, Head of the Division for International Cooperation of the Ministry of Culture. There was also a short speech of congratulation from the Norwegian Ambassador. Generous EEA funding from Norway, Iceland and Liechtenstein has been crucial to the success of the project. Finally, after a short recital from a saxophone performer, Dr Roger Woodley, Vice Chair of the

Category 1 Jury, described the work of Europa Nostra, and emphasised the project's special achievement in having been selected for one of only 15 awards from a large number of 146 entries.

EUROPEAN PARLIAMENT HONORS ELLINIKI ETAIRIA WITH EUROPEAN CITIZEN'S PRIZE

During a ceremony at the offices of the European Parliament in Athens, the European Parliament has awarded the Elliniki Etairia Society for the Environment and Cultural Heritage the European Citizen's Prize – *Civi Europaeo Praemium* for 2012.

Maestro Plácido Domingo, President of EUROPA NOSTRA, in a message read out by Mrs Sneška Quaedvlieg-Mihailović, Secretary General of Europa Nostra, congratulated Elliniki Etairia for its special contribution to the safeguarding of cultural and natural heritage in Europe, and noted: "Today, Europa Nostra celebrates with you and is proud of you. EUROPEAN HERITAGE ALLIANCE 3.3 MEMBER ENCATC CELEBRATED 20 YEARS

The European Network of Cultural Administration Training Centers (ENCATC) organised its 20th Annual Conference at Goldsmiths University of London on 12-14 September. The conference,

organised under UNESCO's patronage, presented case studies, seminars, study visits and keynote speakers from the wider field of culture. Representatives from UNESCO, the European Commission and the European Cultural Foundation hosted debates, including one on European Union strategies to support creative and cultural industries and the new Creative Europe programme. CREATIVE EUROPE - UPDATE

On 17 September, MEP Silva Costa, Rapporteur of the EP's Committee on Culture and Education on the Creative Europe Programme proposal, presented her draft Report on the proposed programme. The Rapporteur proposed to add the safeguarding and enhancing of Europe's cultural heritage as a separate objective within the general objectives of Creative Europe, as strongly advocated by Europa Nostra and by other members of the European Heritage Alliance 3.3. In order to understand the importance of adding the protection of cultural heritage among the general objectives of this programme, the Rapporteur referred to the Framework Convention on Cultural Heritage for Society, one of the most recent documents of the Council of Europe in this field.

Europa Nostra strongly welcomes and supports the report presented by MEP Silva Costa, and in particular the proposed amendments 2, 7, 26 and 39. The vote by the EP's Culture and Education Committee is scheduled for 27 November. [Read more](#)

NEMO ANNUAL CONFERENCE 2012 IN DUBLIN, IRELAND

The 2012 annual conference of NEMO, the Network of European Museum Organisations, was organised on 2-4 November in Dublin (Ireland) in cooperation with the Irish Museums Association. At the National Gallery of Ireland, directors and other representatives from national museum organisations, cultural stakeholders, project partners and similar bodies from all over Europe met to discuss topics relevant to the European museums sector and to exchange ideas and experiences. Two members of the Europa Nostra's Industrial and Engineering Heritage Committee, Francesco Calzolaio (Italy) and Hildebrand de Boer (NL), were invited by the Parliamentary Assembly of the Council of Europe (PACE), to take part in the meeting of the Sub-Committee on Culture, Diversity and Heritage of the PACE Committee on Culture, Science, Education and Media which was organised on 21 September 2012 in Maribor (Slovenia), this year's European Capital of Culture. The main focus of this meeting was on the challenges related to the protection of industrial heritage in Europe.

The Sub-Committee considers industrial heritage as being one of the most important monuments of our common European history. The task of the Sub-Committee is to prepare a document on this topic, which will be adopted at one of the 2013 PACE plenary sessions in Strasbourg. [Read more](#)
